I. *Two Men* Luke 18:10

- Pharisees had a distinguished heritage ...

Tax Collectors sold out their country.

- Pharisees cared deeply about God's Law ...

Tax Collectors cared most about their income.

- Pharisees were widely honored ...

Tax Collectors lost most of their friends.

II. *Two Prayers* Luke 18:11-13

- The Pharisee looked up with pride ...

The Tax Collector looked down in humility.

- The Pharisee boasted ...

The Tax Collector confessed.

- The Pharisee left out God ...

The Tax Collector called out to God.

- The Pharisee compared himself to people ...

The Tax Collector compared himself to God.

III. *Two Results* Luke 18:14

- The Pharisee is thankful for his isolation from inferior people.

- The Tax Collector is thankful for his acceptance by God.

- The Pharisee leaves the Temple unchanged.

- The Tax Collector leaves the Temple completely changed.

Living This Message

- Faith can become unfaithful.

- Self-righteousness has nothing to learn.

- Pride cancels out virtue.

- Humility can overcome sin.

- Modesty asks for help, not applause.
